Pam has offered to make the patterns available to our chapter for the cost of \$30.00 each, unkitted. Should anyone wish to have Pam kit the piece, the cost is \$140.00 each on congress cloth and \$170.00 each on 18 ct. We are considering it for a summer project if anyone is interested. March 20th:

Charted small piece with 5 colors of floss, design by Margery L. Williams. Can be stitched as a Spring Egg, or as a square for a fob or pin cushion. Model at Feb meetings with signup sheet.

April 17th:

Sally's Christmas Lights by Susan Portra for Rainbow Gallery. This is a chart with a light bulb outline tent stitched. There are six suggested model colors and yarn suggestions. There will be 4 stitched models at February and March meetings, with signup sheet. You can use any pattern and any threads to fill these bulbs. They can be stitched on 14, 16, 18, 20, 22 and 24 count canvas by just changing the threads.

May 15th:

Trick or Treat by Cheryl Schaeffer for Rainbow Gallery. This is a fun piece to stitch over the summer in time for fall. The model will be at the Feb, March & April meetings with signup sheet. Threads will be as listed on the chart and then what other threads could be used instead.
