Summer Project-

Kathy Rees has designed a needlepoint star to share with all ANG members- some of you may already be stitching it. It's found on the ANG website under Stitch of the Month (SOTM 2020).

Using great graphs, fun stitches, your choice of colors and threads, the star is worked in 8 sections, starting with January 2020's SOTM thru August 2020's SOTM, with background stitches to follow. Maybe this could be a companion in colors to go with "Winter Scenery", or two colors that just say "try me together". Just have fun with it- we look forward to seeing them in September.



Stitch of the Month 2020-Setup Designed by Kathy Rees

I combined my love of stars and stitches to create this design. My goal is to introduce different stitches and threads to a new needlepointer and to provide a fun to stitch design for the seasoned stitcher. Although I only used two colors (red and blue) for my star, you could make your star monochromatic or use multiple colors. Use my thread choices, choose your own, or raid your stash. I do suggest using a stranded thread for the background.

The design size is 144x144 threads, 8x8 inches.
I used a 12x12 piece of 18ct eggshell canvas and the following threads:

EDITOR'S LETTER

I have been reading my way through the pandemic and not stitching much. I find it difficult to concentrate and disconcerted to find how much I am affected by circumstances. I have been reading and enjoying some new needlework books along with truckloads of mysteries. Warning: some of these are not needlepoint or counted thread.

Willing Hands, the Counted Thread Embroidery of Betsy Morgan has the most charming collection of patterns for stitching accessories, caskets, needle books, scissor fobs, etc. I have my eye on 'virgin queen's stitching wallet.' I like the simplicity of the folded design of the wallet and the lovely embroidery for the outside. A blackwork needlebook and octagonal thread winders are included and a scissor fob. The whole is folded into the wallet which is 3" by 6". A gorgeous book form Inspirations in Australia. The instructions and charts are beautifully drawn and the photography is first-rate.

Embroidered Country Gardens is by Lorna Bateman and published by Search Press from the United Kingdom. This is a lovely book of ideas for surface embroidery and these ideas can also be translated into needlepoint. I can see painted canvases embellished by the miniature flowers and plants from this book. The photography is beautiful, and a pattern sheet is included. Ms. Bateman has included several common garden flowers with stitch suggestions to complete them in a realistic manner. The book includes a section on techniques and materials as well as a section on embroidery stitches.

I find it a refreshment to dip into stitching books of all kinds. And usually, after an idle hour spend looking at, or actually reading, stitching books, I am motivated to get back to my current projects.
